A New Year focus: to choose to love?

^{"21} But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: ²² The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; ²³ they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." – Lamentations 3:21-23

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." – Luke 10:27

Happy New Year! I often think of new beginnings with the new year. Lamentations 3:21-23 encourages me that even when I failed on new year's resolutions, new plans, exercise routines, healthy habits, new Spiritual disciplines; God is still God, God is still faithful, God is still calling me into relationship/ strengthen my relationship! God's mercies are new not just each: new year, new month, new week, but each new day! Thanks be to God!

This new year the Luke passage above comes to mind. What would it look like to love? (Greek: *agape* kind of love, most often associated with God's kind of love. Also, in the Greek this is a verb, so not Hallmark squishy love, but an active choice [choosing to love]).

What would it look like to choose to love God? And choose to love God not just with some parts of us, but with <u>all</u> our hearts, with <u>all</u> our soul (life/ self [think Hokey Pokey: put your whole self in]), with <u>all</u> our strength, and with all our mind?

Spiritual Disciplines help us: draw closer to God, strengthen our relationship with God, and even come back and be reconciled with God. The Holy Spirit works through our participation in Spiritual Disciplines to transform us and helps us improve our relationships with others. Spiritual Disciplines include: prayer, reading the Bible, reading devotionals, worship, giving of time as well as finances, serving, sharing what God has done, journaling, fasting from food or things, sitting in silence, enjoying & honoring a Sabbath day, studying the Bible in a small group, confessing sins & shortcomings, repenting, practicing forgiveness, participating in Christian fellowship, partaking in an accountability group to name a few.

What would it look like to choose to love our neighbor? These neighbors are not just our friends and family, those easy to love; but also our 'extra-grace-required' porcupine-like/ hard to love: family members, co-workers, geographically-near actual neighborhood neighbors, people who disagree with us, etc. How can we demonstrate God's love to those around us, those on social media, etc.? How can we invite and assist people: to come to God, to accept God's offer of relationship through Jesus the Christ, to grow in their relationship with God?

What would it look like to choose to love ourselves? Sometimes one of the hardest people to love and to forgive is our self. Often what we say to our self, we would not say to our friends. So, instead of beating up yourself, think of what you would say to a friend in your situation, then say that to yourself. Spiritual disciplines can help you to choose to love yourself as Christ loves you, as the Holy Spirit transforms you to become more and more Christ-like.

This year as we seek to choose to love God with all our heart, soul, strength, and mind, and our neighbor as self, what Spiritual Discipline(s) will you start or pick up again? When you fail, start again, trusting that God is still faithful, chooses to love you, and still seeks to be in relationship with you. Thanks be to God!
