"10 While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. 11 They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." 12 Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. 13 When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. 14 All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers."

(Acts 1:10-14)

In this time of the Kingdomtide or Ordinary Time, the season after Pentecost, which spans all of summer and much of the fall, it is easy to be distracted, overwhelmed, gazing at the sky, passively waiting for Jesus to return. Yet this is a season of growth, hence the green color of paraments in our worship spaces. We are called to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We do this by sharing the love of God through our words and actions with all people we encounter, and by helping them grow in the love of God. To help us move forward fulfilling our mission, we need to answer these three questions* individually and corporately (as First UMC Edna).

Who are we now? This is a question of <u>identity</u>. The "now" is added because it is often easier to describe who we were in the past (5, 10, 20, 50 years ago) than who we are in the present. The past shapes whom we are and whom we can become, but it does not restrict us or define us. Who are we now?

What has God called us to do or be now? This is a question of <u>purpose</u>. What disciplines will help us grow into the people and church that God dreams and desires us to become? What has God called us to do or be now?

Who is our neighbor now? This is a question of <u>context</u>. We are in a specific time and location. What is our context? Our context is different from First UMC Seadrift, First UMC Victoria, First UMC Houston, and Iglesia Metodista de Puerto Rico. Our context is also different from First UMC Edna of 1873, of 1973, or of 2003. This area has changed some over the decades and life has changed over the decades. Who is our neighbor now?

I invite and urge you to join me in prayer each day: asking and listening to how God is calling us to answer these questions, and for courage and obedience to follow where God leads.


The charity accepts monetary donations in the form of cash and checks, and takes donations of good, usable furniture, clothing, shoes, nonperishable food items, and other lightly used items.


Pastor Kelli gave a special lesson about Holy Week using Resurrection Eggs to our children during Sunday School on 3/26.

Stations of the Cross

"This Way of the Cross is a modern adaptation of an old Christian tradition dating back to the fifth century. The fourteen traditional Stations of the Cross mark the passage from the moment Jesus was condemned to death until his burial in the tomb. The Way of the Cross was originally developed and used by Christian pilgrims to the Holy Land, and it came to be identified with the Lenten season to prepare the people of God for the season of repentance that Lent represents — although it can be used at other times of devotion." (GBOD)

"Those used here all have a biblical basis. In any case, the "Way of the Cross" as a devotion went out of style for many, and it slowly lost its place as a form of prayer for the people. This resource seeks to make accessible again a rich experience of Christian prayer and participation in the moments of Christs passion." (GBOD)

We ask this through that same Christ, our Lord. Amen!





COWBOY CAVIAR

INGREDIENTS

6 Roma tomatoes, diced 1 bell pepper, seeded & diced

1 medium onion, finely diced 2 jalapeno peppers, seeded & finely diced

1 large avocado, diced 15 oz can corn, drained

15 oz can black beans, rinsed & drained 1/2 bunch of cilantro (about 1/2 cup chopped)

3-4 Tbsp lime juice 1/2 cup Italian Dressing

4 medium garlic cloves, pressed 1 tsp salt or season to taste

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. In a large mixing bowl, combine diced tomatoes, chopped onion and bell pepper, seeded and diced jalapeno, sliced avocado, drained corn, rinsed and drained black beans and chopped cilantro.
- 2. Stir in 3-4 Tbsp of lime juice, 1/2 cup of Italian dressing, 4 pressed garlic cloves and 1 tsp of salt or season to taste.
- 3. Mix everything together and serve with tortilla chips.
